Serena Collins (Cornwall Council)

Serena gave a comprehensive review of the county situation, including: Job Club; Interpreter work; Social meetings for families; Strategic group including all

partners (DWP; Health; Housing etc.) meet regularly.

Cornwall Council has taken a slow, steady approach; there is now a greater willingness to be more pro-active.

A hybrid model of establishing a family in Launceston is suggested: The Council will take on the draw-down of government funding; (£8K per person); the community group would be willing to work on housing, integration, schools etc.

Caution urged: groundwork to be done to combat fear, racism, etc.

IOM (International Organisation of Migration) all day training on 27th March; we must send representatives.

Michael Quirk has offered TEFL help; he works with the Bude family & we'd welcome his input. Sylvia Wright has also volunteered her expertise.

Serena will provide a 'wish list' of skills & resources our group will need.

Legal specialist skills re: immigration are much in demand; immigrants will have a 5 year 'leave to remain' status, but all are unsure about what happens after 5 years.

NHS Kernow receive funds for health & dentistry. Mental health support is also needed; FT has experience and can guide us.

Our housing offer is currently being checked by police, and will also have to be approved by Serena on behalf of CC.

It was proposed that we pursue the 'hybrid model' outlined. This was carried unanimously.
